Languages Ladder

Level 9: I can understand a wide range of authentic texts in familiar contexts.

Level 8: I can understand texts including some unfamiliar material from which I can recognize attitudes and emotions.

Level 7: I can understand longer texts and recognize people's point of view.

Level 6: I can understand the difference between present, past and future events in a range of texts.

Level 5: I can understand the main points and opinions in the written texts from various contexts.

Level 4: I can understand the main points and some of the details from short written texts in familiar contexts.

Level 3: I can understand the main points from a short written text in clear printed script.

Level 2: I can understand and read out familiar written phrases.

Level 1: I can recognize and read out a few familiar words and phrases.

On completing this stage,

You should be able to engage confidently with the text even when some language is unfamiliar.

On completing this stage,

*You should be able to use the English prompts to help you explore the whole text and extract basic information.
You should be able to re-read frequently a variety of short texts.
You should have some understanding of a few simple grammatical structures and sentence patterns.*

On completing this stage,

*You should be able to make links between some phonemes, rhymes and spellings, and read aloud familiar words.
You should recognize some familiar words in written form. You should be able to read aloud (with confidence, making a good attempt at pronunciation) and show understanding of a range of written language.*
