Pupil Premium Grant 2020 – 2021

Pupil Premium is an amount of money paid into school in regard of the following:

- Pupils who receive Free School Meals [FSM]
- Post-adopted children
- Pupils who have parents employed by the armed forces

At The Curzon CE Primary School, Pupil Premium money is used to ensure all FSM children and LAC children are supported in making at least good academic progress, with the aim of making at least expected progress.

Total Amount Delegated to this school 2020 - 2021: £11 760.

How do we use the Pupil Premium Grant at The Curzon CE Primary School?

Following an analysis of the needs of FSM children in our setting which will include a mental health and well-being analysis due to long time away from a school setting due to Covid19 and a pupil progress and attainment analysis, we plan to spend our pupil premium grant 2020 - 2021 on the following:

Individual intervention sessions for mental health/ wellbeing sessions as well as academic sessions - £5000

Individual lessons for 7 children for Ma and Eng x 3 a week

Individual time for as many children as necessary to reduce anxiety x3 a week

Small group intervention sessions for mental health/ wellbeing sessions as well as academic sessions - £5000

We support a range of children which include those with learning needs, behaviour difficulties and social/emotional needs. Some of our work supports children in small group activities/individual activities or discussions to enable them to make as much progress as they are able. Some groups are focused particularly on early reading and phonics. Others focus on maths, writing and building social and emotional skills and resilience. X 3 a week

Enrichment activities - £2000

The pupil premium budget is used to subsidise school visits, activities where parental contributions are requested and after school clubs or music tuition for those children where payment is a barrier to participation. Families currently

entitled to free school meals can have access to these activities subsidised if needed to ensure that children can take part.

Impact on Attainment

We are constantly evaluating the impact of this funding. We look at individual attainment and progress in detail on a termly basis. We use teacher assessment of attainment and also discuss children's achievements more widely. In these unprecedented times, the main aims of the employment of these initiatives in school aims to:

- Reduce anxiety and other behavioural issues to enable children to socialise appropriately with peers and adults in a school setting, access learning, work in groups with others more successfully, organise their learning and complete homework
- Allow children to keep pace with their peers in learning
- Enable children to gain confidence in areas of Maths and English that they may find challenging
- Enable us to plan extracurricular activities (as allowed) such as musical instrument tuition to enhance learning
