

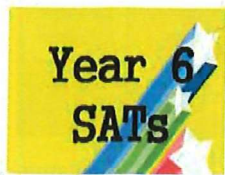

Year 6 Standard Assessment Tests



(SATs) Year 6 will be sitting their SATs in reading, grammar/spelling and maths in the week beginning Monday 11TH May . As many of you will know, SATs are national curriculum tests, which alongside teacher assessment of English writing and science, are used to measure school performance and to make sure individual pupils have the support that they need as they move into secondary school. It is therefore essential that all our Year 6 children attend each day (Monday 11th May to Thursday 14th

May) to ensure that all assessments can take place. More details will follow in due course however in the meantime, we kindly ask that you please avoid booking any appointments for your child during that week.

National assessments

As we move into the spring and summer terms, several national statutory assessments will take place across primary schools. These include the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check, which assesses children's developing phonics knowledge and the Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check, designed to ensure pupils have quick recall of their times tables. Our Year 6 children will also be preparing for their end-of-key-stage SATs, which provide a snapshot of their attainment and progress in reading, writing, and mathematics.

Over the coming months, teachers will continue to support pupils through high-quality teaching and gentle preparation, ensuring they feel confident and ready. We will share further information closer to each assessment window, but please be assured that our focus remains on helping every child do their best while keeping their wellbeing at the heart of everything we do.
